Dr. Ernst, Vice President for Innovation and Strategy at Excelsior College, welcomed everyone.

The plenary speaker was Jane W. Blair from the New York State Education Department (NYSED). She presented information about the New York State license certification and examination process. As of January 1, 2014, the fundamentals exam (FE) is now computer-based and offered four times a year at 2-month intervals (Jan-Feb, April-May, July-August, October-November). Students from an ETAC-ABET accredited Bachelor of Science in Engineering Technology program can sit for the FE exam after they have graduated. Students register through NCEES. Results of the testing are available in 7-10 days.

The plenary speaker on FE/PE registration and testing was discussed, as well as proposed changes to allow engineering technology students to sit for the FE their senior year and to receive an EIT certificate when the FE was passed. A motion was made by John Stratton to have CETNYS write a letter of support for the proposed changes. Jayne Baran seconded the motion and the motion was unanimously supported.

Seamless transfer issues were discussed (limit of 64 credits, questions about waivers to the 64 credits) A motion was made by Fred Schoenfeld (and seconded by Jayne Baran) to send a letter to Tina Good (President, Faculty Council of Community Colleges) expressing the concerns by NYSETA members. All members voted in favor of the motion.
